
That means with the addition of these new holidays One Traveller guests will have saved the equivalent of 40,000 plastic bottles – or enough water to fill 40 London buses!

A place which is truly out of this world...

hen you hear the ice carving on the glaciers of Patagonia, it's like a continuous roll of thunder. It's awe-inspiring and, close up, you can only marvel at the enormity of these glacial monuments of the sea.

South America is a continent to take your breath away – a vast landscape

overflowing with natural wonders and cosmopolitan cities.

For several years now many of you in our One Traveller family have asked for South America to be added to our list of long-haul destinations – and what a trip it promises to be!

Starting in Brazil, you will visit Rio and the iconic Christ the Redeemer monument and

Sugarloaf Mountain, staying in a hotel on the famous Copacabana beach.

Moving inland, there is a chance to see the mightly Iguazu Falls – the world's largest waterfall system.

From here we cross into Argentina, exploring the historic quarters of Buenos Aires before journeying to the Pampas flatlands experiencing the horseback culture and traditions of the gauchos before heading south to see the glaciers of Patagonia. Then your trip concludes with a tour of Chile's capital of Santiago.

The 23-day trip has been about twoand-a-half years in the making and there's a lot of elements involved.

I went in February to do all the detailed research, inspecting 25 different hotels and narrowing it down to seven, as well as eating in the restaurants where we will take guests.

I wanted to include a lot of experiences so one of the main features is the cultural and culinary side – from watching a tango show over dinner, to a food walking tour where you sample meals in five different restaurants from all corners of Brazil.

And in Chile there is also the chance for some wine-tasting at Chile's largest winery in the

Maipo Valley.

In Argentina you'll visit an estanzia to see for yourself these quaint manor house traditions and try out some horse-riding amid the vast open spaces and far away horizons. The gauchos prepare a barbeque lunch and afterwards do a folklore show where you can see the costumes they wear.

But as I said at the start, for me the most breathtaking part of the trip is the visit to the glacier ice fields of El Calafate in Patagonia. You'll see the glacier from both the north and south sides and go right up to the face by boat to actually feel its height and power.

From the north side, you'll then see it from above, and if you're lucky enough you get to hear it carve as well. At Torres del Paine in the very south of Patagonia, the National Park is home to local wildlife including pumas, foxes and rare llama-like guanacos. The glacial scenery is out of this world!










### Weird science...



# Springtime view of Venice

enice has always been near the top of my bucket list of places to visit so when I saw that One Traveller were introducing it as a holiday destination in 2019, I jumped at the opportunity to go.

The holiday was in early April, which meant that although Venice was busy – when is it ever not! – it was before the cruise ship season starts.

Our hotel was in the perfect location on one of the smaller canals, a five minute walk from San Salute church and the Grand Canal, with St. Mark's Square directly across the water, and

a gentle stroll through backstreets and over bridges to lots of lovely shops and galleries plus the Peggy Guggenheim Museum. On three of the days, we had waterbus passes, which allowed us to explore the city at our own pace during any free time.

The first full day was spent doing a walking tour of the city and visiting many of the landmarks for which

Venice is famous throughout the world - St. Mark's Square, including the Basilica; the Doge's Palace with its jaw-droppingly beautiful private apartments plus interesting prison cells and offices; the Bridge of Sighs (which I found out was so named because prisoners on their way to the cells had to cross this bridge and often took their last breaths of fresh air!) and the Rialto Bridge. We also saw lots of the gondolas for which Venice is so well-known and I was surprised at how opulent many of them were,

What is amazing in Georgia is there are four-and-a-half million people speaking and writing in their own distinct language that's very different to everything else.

It is a testament to their resilience because throughout their history they've had everybody invade them and colonize them, and yet somehow they've come out of it with their own distinct cultural identity.

That is a big thing with Georgia that I think will surprise people.

The climate is surprisingly diverse for such a moderately small country - mild in spring, hot in summer, with short sharp winters. In the Caucasus the climate is Alpine-like with heavy snowfalls in winter. In fact, warmer

Whether it's exploring the charming old town of capital city Tbilisi with its narrow winding streets and brightly painted multistoreyed houses, or the tree-lined boulevards of Batumi – very reminiscent of the French Ouarter of New Orleans, the blend

Not surprisingly, it was the most sought-after wine for the whole of the Soviet Union era.


Georgians regard their country as the motherland of wine and I think the wine country will blow people away!

Today's Georgian cuisine is a rich interplay between Mediterranean and Middle Eastern tastes, but remains steadfastly true to itself. Walnuts are the workhorse of Georgian cooking, an essential ingredient in menu stalwarts like chicken bazhe and vegetable pkhali (chopped salads), adding flavour as sauces, and even coarsely chopped and candied in honey – in a simple dessert known as gozinaki.



Guests on our One Traveller holidays often tell us that the cuisine is one of the highlights of their trip. And here are our top 10 foodie destinations as voted by you (via our feedback forms)

### 1 Talin, Riga and Vilnius

The Baltic countries may not be well known for their food, but it certainly got the thumbs up amongst our One Traveller guests, claiming top spot!

A popular dish is 'Cepilinai', potato dough stuffed with cheese - real calorie bombs, but delicious!

You said: The itinerary was perfect as was the choice of hotels and restaurants.

Well done, One Traveller.

### Scenic Lake Garda and Spa

Ah yes, Italy! It's no surprise that Italian holidays have grabbed three spots in our culinary Top 10. Just think of pizza, spaghetti, ravioli, lasagna, Parmiggiano Reggiano (parmesan cheese), prosciutto (ham), ice cream (in Italian: gelato), espresso and many more.

You said: The quality of food in the hotel was exceptional. It's the best hotel food I have ever had.

### 3 Lake Maggiore

Still hungry? There's Swiss cuisine to enjoy on this trip too – as we're about to discover!

You said: Fabulous holiday, Excellent food in a superb hotel, good choice of restaurants for the two meals away from the hotel.

### 4 Swiss Alpine Railways

The country's ubiquitous vegetable dish, rösti (hashbrown potatoes), is excellent when popped into the oven coated with cheese, which melts and turns a golden brown.

You said: The holiday package was amazing. Hotel Steinmattli was situated in stunning Alpine surroundings and staff could not be nicer. The food was excellent!

### **5** Vienna

Wiener schnitzel, a bread-crumbed and fried escalope traditionally with veal but more commonly today with turkey or pork) is something of a national dish.

You said: The gala dinner and concert were absolutely brilliant, most enjoyable.

### 6 Sri Lanka

Potato and lentil (Dahl) curries, a variety of salads, vegetable dishes as well as breads and pastas are always available in Sri Lanka, while the freshest local tropical fruits are always available in plentiful supply including papaya, pineapple, melon, rambutan (like lychee) and red and yellow bananas.

You said: I really enjoyed the variety of lunch stops, which contributed to each days' enjoyment.

### India – Delhi, Royal Rajasthan, Bombay

From exotic pastries to the deep-fried Dal Bathi Churma, a Rajistan treat, there is plenty to make the mouth water and in the 'Pink City' of Jaipur you can enjoy dinner and a cookery lesson with a local family.

You said: The dinner and cookery demonstration with a local family in Jaipur was very interesting and informative, 10/10!

### 8 Vietnam and Cambodia

A classic Vietnamese dish is pho, a fragrant, rich rice noodle soup typically made with beef or chicken and served with Vietnamese basil, lime, bean sprouts and chillies.

You said: High end restaurants and meals with local families, both offering the most amazing quality of food; from the largest prawns I have ever seen and the tastiest of broths to sampling those crickets and a tarantula!

### 9 Cairo and Nile Cruise

Falafel - a well-known dish in the Middle East is thought to have originated in Egypt. Did you know that Aish – the Egyptian word for bread – also means life?

You said: The Marriott by the pyramids was absolutely superb. It had the best food I have ever had on a trip.

### 🔟 Umbria

We're pretty full now, so espresso anyone?

You said: We all appreciated the choice of restaurants we were taken to. We had super evenings and lunches with very good food indeed.



### New for 2020 – The Basque Country

Foodies will simply love the feast available in our new holiday to the Basque country in 2020, which is being put together by Product Manager Nicky.

The region's cuisine, built around

authentic and local products like cured meats, salt cod, sheep's and goat's cheese, piquillo peppers, fresh anchovies, will be brought to life with a cookery lesson where you will enjoy the fruits of your labour. You'll head to the Rioja wine region where you'll visit the medieval city of Laguardia and the wineries around it to sample some of the local wines.

# Peter's more than just a Day Tripper

an you imagine what the world would have been like without the Beatles? The music of the Fab Four has touched all corners of the earth and endures to this day.

And Peter Pilbeam, a regular One Traveller guest, was instrumental in giving John, Paul, Ringo, and George their big break on the national stage.

Now aged 90, back in the 1960s Peter was working for the BBC on a show aimed at teenagers which went out daily at 5pm.

"I was a producer for BBC Radio 2 and auditioned them and got them their first five national broadcasts," he explains. "My particular thread was called 'Here We Go' and I guested a pop group on each programme."

According to the website www. theBeatlesBible.com, these recordings were broadcast between March 1962 and 1963.

And for the Beatles it was a turning point in their careers – albeit one which they were still getting used to!

"They were four very frightened lads from Liverpool, they weren't sure what had hit them," Peter recalls. "They'd just come back from Hamburg and Brian Epstein had just got hold of them when they came to me for audition.

"Pete Best was involved in the first audition, but by the time we did the first broadcast Ringo had taken over the drummer's seat.

"I would sit with them while they were chatting away over a coffee and cigarette. I remember talking to John in particular.

"The girls used to scream and we used to have to smuggle them out!" Peter also helped introduce the band to the music publisher Dick James, who created the company Northern Songs to publish their original music.

"He was a friend of mine and he said to me once over lunch in London 'Have you heard of a group called the Beatles?'

"I said 'yes' why and he answered that he had been offered a chance to work with them. I told him to take it!" Peter's BBC career also included him auditioning the comedian Les

Dawson for his first national radio slot. And he retired early in 1987 after being with the organisation for 44 years, since the age of 15. including taking 10 One Traveller holidays to destinations ranging from China to a recent trip to Lake Maggiore. In September he is off to at Christmas.

And did he ever wonder what would have happened had he failed the Beatles at that audition?

"I knew they were going to be big," he says. "They would still have got there, but it would have been later. I gave them their first nudge up the ladder of success!"



"This is so important," Penny adds. "We can make such a difference to their lives."

"We cannot thank them enough for their support of our work.


"Deer are admitted to the Centre
